RE: German Consulate (Canada) - Recognition as Notaries

I am writing to you to provide confirmation that two members of this law firm (Lawrence K. Evans, Q.C. and the undersigned, Patrick C. Lamey) are both on a list at the German Consulate Office (Canada) in Montreal, Quebec, which formally recognizes specific professionals as Notaries Public qualified to witness the signatures of German citizens while in Canada.

Specifically, we are recognized as proper witnesses for the following:


1. Witnessing the signatures of applicants on various immigration application and applications for passports, including the notarization of certified true copies of documents to be included with such applications.
2. Witnessing of "life certifications" when German citizens residing in Nova Scotia apply for the renewal of their Germany old age pension benefits.
3. Certification of the signature of a German citizen (resident in Nova Scotia) on legal documents. Such documents are then forwarded to the Consulate representative in Nova Scotia for sealing ("legalization").

In these matters, we can and do (when circumstances require) work closely with the formally appointed Consulate representative in this region (Anthony L. Chapman, QC).
